For three-year olds and upwards, the *bond fide* property of owners resident in the Dominion. Three horses, the property of different owners, to start, or no race. A challenge cup, value \$1,000, the gift of Hiram Walker & Sons, Distillers, of Walkerville, Ontario; and a Sweepstakes of \$20 each, half forfeit, to which is added \$600 cash by the Club, \$150 of the added money to second, and \$50 to third. The cup to be held for one year by the owner of the winner, and to become the absolute property of anybody winning same two years in succession. Weight for age. The winner of a race, value \$700, in 1894 or 1895, to carry 5 lbs. extra; and of two such, or of one of \$1,000, 7 lbs. Maidens allowed 5 lbs. 1¼ mile. [*New cup.
