The old one was a disgrace to the City, Province, and Dominion; the present one is in appearance and convenience for the work which should be done in it, probably superior to any other Post Office in British America. The public will now reasonably expect that the postal work will heretofore be well done, in Halifax at least, and that consequently the complaints against the office will be much less frequent than they have been.

4. SABRATH BREAKING.—We are very sorry to learn that the Commissioners of the Intercolonial Railway took their departure from Halifax on Sabbath evening last at 7 o'clock, by special train for Truro.

5.
