exported, which experience has proved to be useless, the House is obliged to decline

the application of any public money to this purpole.

Sixth.—Refolved, That these Resolutions be transmitted by a Committee of this Flouse to the Agent of the Province, to be said before his Majesty's Ministers, with an assurance, that this House will chearfully appropriate a part of the public Revenue upon any rational system by which a branch of business may be established and improved, which will tend to promote the general interests of the British Empire.—Which motion being seconded, thereupon, the sirst, second, third and sourth Resolutions were read throughout a first and second time, and, upon the Question severally put thereupon, agreed to by the House.
