WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Island stands prorogued until Tuesday the 28th Proclamation prorogu-ing Parliament to the day of October instant: And whereas I think fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly 4th of December, 1834. until Thursday the 4th day of December next.

I do therefore prorogue the said General Assembly until Thursday the 4th day of December next, of which all persons concerned are required and commanded to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
