

In other words instead of endeavoring to bind the different powers to a specific endorsement of the conclusions reached by the Congress, the purpose in view is to turn the public opinion of the world into certain desired channels. It is argued that nearly all governments are now the creations of popular sentiment / They hold office by virtue of public favor and are driven from power when they run contrary thereto. The proposed Peace Congress, therefore, will seek to inculcate in the minds of the people of every civilized power, the view that war must cease and that some plan in consonance with the advanced stage of civilization must be adopted for the determination of all international disputes. If the members of the Congress are as representative, and as deeply entrenched in the confidence of the various nations as is hoped will be the case, it is proposed to make the sitting continuous until some substantial results are attain-

Means will be taken to spread the reports of the deliberations of the Congress over the entire world. They will be translated into every language and published in the newspapers of all countries. The delegates will be unhampered by instructions from any government and will be entirely free to follow their convictions.

While it is difficult to foresee what; if any, practical results will ensue from so novel a plan, it is clear that it possesses marked possibilities. In advancing the theory that the ultimate abolishment of war must be brought about through the pressure of universal public opinion, the pro-
