Mr. P. H. Bowyer (East Kent), who suggested the amendment to the Municipal act providing for the taxatien by the municipality of the mineral rights reserved by the Canada Company in their sale of land to the farmers—which amendment has been

Company in their sale of land to the farmers—which amendment has been embodied by the Government in the new act—laid before Hon. Mr. Hanna, the Provincial Secretary, the problem of the collection of the tax.

Mr. Bowyer pointed out that unless the procedure for collection was specifically outlined the company might make an effort to dodge or refuse to pay the tax in an effort to have it charged up against the farm or surface rights. The member for East Kent suggested that a similar course be followed to that which obtains in other municipal taxation. If the company to the pay the mineral tax

pany failed to pay its mineral tax for three years, the mineral rights would be put up for tax sale and could be bought in by the farmowner. In this way the tax could be collected or redress given to the farmer or land-owner.

Hon. Mr. Hanna said that the course suggested by Mr. Bowyer was what would follow upon the owner of the mineral interest refusing to pay the tax on such interest and that the sale of such interest and that the sale of such interest would in no way prejudice or affect the owner of the surface rights.

Fish and Game Bill.

The House followed on in committee on the fish, fur bearing animals and game bill of Hon. Dr. Reaume. Mr. Graham broached the question of game preservel leases which came into prominence through the application of the Tademac Club. Mr. Whitney, taking up the matter, said the transaction sought was a sale of land, not a lease. He believed, however, that the waters of the bay were under lease and the application was for the purchase of land on two sides thereof.
