ILLEGAL SCHOOLS.

Let teachers and trustees consider the responsibility placed upon school officers by the Act requiring the study of Hygiene and Temperance. No matter whether that law is one we consider good or otherwise, it is our duty to see it enforced so long as it is law.

This is now the last clause of the Act reads, as can be seen in the Journal of Education for April, 1893, in Part II., on page 3.

It shall be the duty of school officers and school inspectors to report to the Council of Public Instruction any failure on the part of the trustees or teachers of the section under their control to carry out the provisions of this Act.
