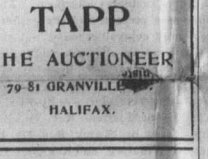

Some months ago when the Burlington road began cutting its force because of the financial depression, orders were issued to lay off the drinking men, regardless of the length of time they had been in the employ of the company.

"A man cannot be drunk to-night and show up to-morrow ready to give his employer his best work," says George W. Loomis, assistant to General Manager Holdrege of the Burlington.

"There was a time when employers did not care what their men did when off duty. But that time has passed. We know we cannot get the best work out of a man who drinks. And we know that a drinking man, even though he never drinks when on duty, is not so safe as a man who never drinks at all.

It is not a matter of temperance with the Burlington; it is a matter of business, pure and simple. We have made a very strict rule against drinking, both when on duty and when off duty."

The American Express Company has also joined the movement against drinking, whether the man be on duty or off duty.

The Western division, with headquarters in Omaha, says:

"We find that almost every defalcation has its beginning in drinking. If we find a man drinking when off duty, he is warned. The second time he is discharged. If we find him drinking on duty he is discharged.

The drinking, even when off duty, often leads to gambling and other bad habits, and the next thing there is a defalcation. Our men must not drink, even when off duty."

The big packing companies in South Omaha, which employ ten thousand unskilled laborers, have not taken a stand. At least no attempts have been made to prevent the men from drinking when off duty.

The office men and skilled workmen, however, are not permitted to drink, even when not engaged on the companies' business.

Like the other railroads, the Union Pacific has drawn very close lines over its employees where the use of liquor is concerned, and all men found drinking are discharged.

These employers insist that the stand they have taken is not one against drinking in general, but against drinking by their employees.

The situation has scared the saloon-keepers and brewers of the west. Many of them are being driven out of business, and in their efforts to prevent the non-drinking rule from spreading they fear the vote of the prohibitionists, coupled with the business sentiment, will drive them out entirely.

The state convention of the Nebraska Retail Liquor Dealers' Association on June 3 went on record as being opposed to the saloon in politics and formally disbanded any political organization existing among the saloon-keepers of the state. Resolutions were passed unanimously agreeing to keep out of politics and not to contribute one cent to the campaign funds of any political party, no matter what its platform and promises.

The convention also gave notice that its members would fight the "lives" in the larger cities and would ask the annulment of the license of any saloon-keeper found violating any law whatever, especially Sunday closing and selling liquor after hours.
