WINNIPEG, Man., Aug. 29 .- The following crop bulletin is issued to-day: Weather to-day and during the past two weeks has been most favorable for harvesting and in consequence nearly all the grain has been cut and over half stacked. In most districts threshing has commenced. The new wheat has been marketed at several points and is a splendid sample. In Morden districts, where the crops suffered most from want of rain in time, it is now estimated the rield will be 25 bushels per acre. At Portage La Prairie 28 bushels per acre is GENTLEMEN. latter place from eleven bushels of wheat sown threshed 235 bushels, and many fields will yield from forty to fifty bushels per acre. Samples show that this season's grain is by far the best ever town in Manitoba, the berry being flump and color bright.
