Nothing in the roller skating line at the popular Alexandra Rink has ever equalled the opening on Saturday after-





Not more than 2,560 acres shall be leased to one individual or company. A royaity at the rate of five cents per ton shall be collected on the mer-chantable coal mined. QUART2-A person explorent years of age. or over, he is a chim 1,600 x 1,600 feet. The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least 5100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in liou thereof. When \$t00 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.
