Unfortunately, it is not definitely known how the infection is carried. The infecting agent is found in the discharges of the nose and throat and is carried from here to the brain and spinal cord. Apparently the virus can be transmitted directly by the contaminated nasal discharges, or these discharges may be carried by a person, a fly or other insect.
