Leprosy.

There has been some discussion in regard to leprosy in the public prints.

Leprosy is hereditary, but it is held by some authorities that it is not actually contagious. There was a case in Bellevue Hospital, New York, some time ago, and no bad effects were traceable to the presence of the patients. On the other hand, it is contended by good authorities that leprosy is contagious and that where one case is known other cases soon follow.

Out of fifty millions of people in the United States, there are only fifty cases of leprosy. In this country there is a colony of lepers at Tracadie, Nova Scotia where a hospital is maintained for them. The disease prevails in China, where its hereditary character makes it difficult to eradicate. The patients are always isolated.

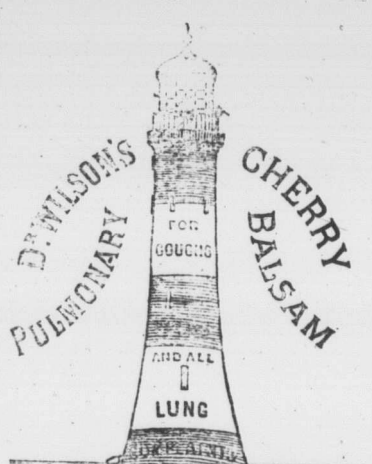
