War News.

Messages Received Previous to 9 a.m. OFFICIAL.

LONDON, May 25. Governor, Newfoundland: Italy has declared war upon Austria-Hungary, and Germany has declared war upon Italy.

LONDON, May 25. Governor, Newfoundland: General French reports seven machine guns captured on the 16th to the near Festubert. Yesterday three German batteries were silenced by our guns; one was destroyed by direct hits east of Ypres.

The French Government reports enemy attacks repulsed near Steenstrate, and prisoners captured. North of Arras fresh progress has been made by British troops, north of La Bassée and north of Neuville.

The Russian Government reports a successful offensive in Galicia. Over 2,000 prisoners were captured with over a dozen machine guns and material.

Italian troops have crossed the frontier at Friuli. An air raid on Venice arsenal and ineffective bombardments at various points on the Italian coast have been repelled.

HARCOURT. CANADIAN CASUALTIES. OTTAWA, May 25.

Losses by Canadians in last Thursday's engagement were very considerable. Latest figures show total casualties of 390, of which 66 were killed, 132 wounded, and 192 missing.

ON THE WESTERN FRONT. PARIS, May 25.

The French War Office this afternoon gave out the following report: It was a night of considerable activity between the sea and Arras. In Belgium, following a violent bombardment, a German attacking column endeavored to gain footing on the highway between Langemarck and Ypres.

ITALIANS ON AUSTRIAN SOIL. ROME, May 25. An official announcement was made by the War Office to-day, saying that Italian forces had penetrated Austria, occupying the Caporetto heights between the Judrio and the Isonzo and the towns of Cormons, Cervignago and Terzo.

GERMANY'S REPLY FORECAST. LONDON, May 25.

The following despatch was received by the Exchange Telegraph Co. from Amsterdam: The German Government has asked America for further delay of a week for its reply to the note concerning the sinking of the Lusitania.

AEROPLANE SUNK. LONDON, May 25.

Telegrams from Harwich say that a British destroyer arrived there, bringing a German submarine Lieutenant and a mechanic from a Taube aeroplane, which was found floating in the North Sea.

SPECIAL LEGISLATION TO BE ENACTED. LONDON, May 25.

Probability of special legislation to be enacted to prolong the life of Parliament is stronger than ever, in view of the reconstruction of the Cabinet.


