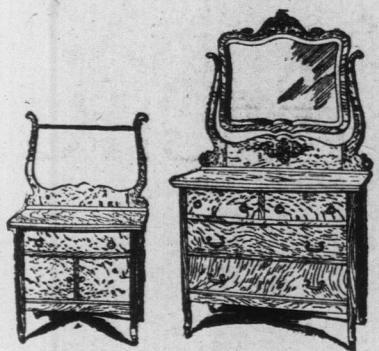

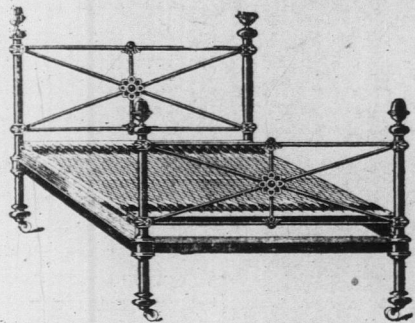

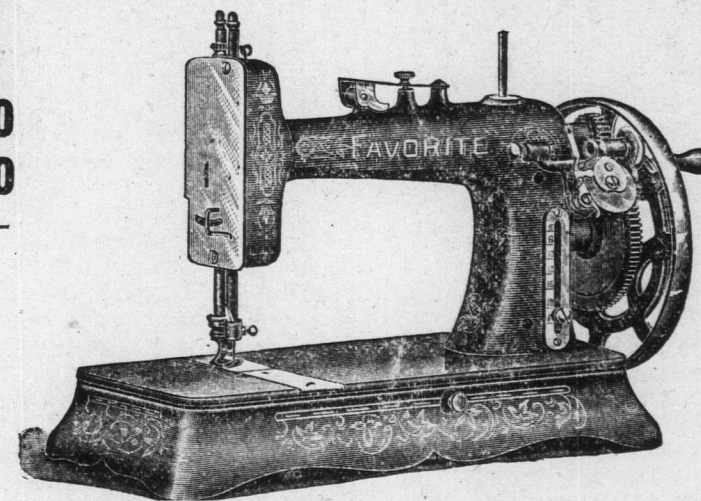

#### M. P. and the Turks.

"Wonderful Shots and Have Eyes Like Hawks," he Writes From Dardanelles.

Lieut. the Hon. F. S. McLaren, M. P. writing from the Dardanelles, says: "The Turks are wonderful shots, and have eyes like hawks. As soon as I put up my periscope bullets whizz round it, and at any moment one expects it to be shot from one's hand. "I have done a good deal of work in the Indian trenches. It is thrilling to see them chanting prayers in the evening, and reading from old religious books, which look as if they had come straight from the British Museum. They spend most of the day washing and cooking strange flat things like pancakes. Their English is very limited. "I have just been lunching with a machine gun officer, and he tells me how wonderfully and calmly they attack at night. A few hundred yards away there are 200 Turkish prisoners I had a talk with one, who complained bitterly that he had been fed on nothing but olive soup. "They have marvellous 'undies' spotted with dragons and crescents. Most of them are wounded, and our doctors were looping off fingers and toes and bandaging them up, while our soldiers were swooping identification discs, water-bottles, and such like for cigarettes."

Did you ever think what a good pie could be made from the bits of jelly and fruit that accumulate? If there seems to be too much juice, add a little cornstarch.

Ducks are a good investment in the poultry yard, as they lay well through the summer, and the eggs are excellent for cooking purposes.

It is more pleasant for the guest if the hostess will not make plans for every minute of the day, rushing her about from place to place.

Every family will appreciate variety in bread. Whole wheat bread is nutritious, corn bread is good for breakfast, and there is nothing better than rye muffins.

If you want to stock your chicken yard, it is better to buy little chicks

already hatched and raise them with the brooder. In this way you will save the expense of buying old birds. Cream soup is a pleasant nourishment for sick people. To one pint of boiling water add a half cupful of sweet cream. Season to taste and add tiny squares of well-toasted bread.

A fresh mildew spot can be removed with lemon juice and exposure to the sun. If it is an old spot, dissolve a tablespoonful of chloride of lime in four parts of cold water and soak the fabric.
