### The Recount.

#### PROHIBITION VOTE 374 TO THE GOOD.

The recount is over and the net change is the loss of 10 votes for Prohibition. The surplus of 384 over the limit required for the Act to bring Prohibition into force next January has been reduced to 374. The reductions were made as follows: St. John's East 13, St. John's West 4, Bay de Verde 3, Harbour Main 2, Harbour Grace 4, Trinity 2, Gross loss 28. The gains were as follows: Placentia 2, Fortune Bay 4, St. George's 3, St. Barbe's 1, Burin 1, Twillingate 4, Port de Grave 3, Gross gain 18. This gives a net change of 10 votes. When we consider that over 30,000 ballot papers were examined the changes on the Recount are negligible quantities in regard to the general decision of the electorate. In five districts the recount of Mr. Justice Johnson and the principal counts of the Returning Officers of the several districts agreed exactly. In other words, there are no changes in the counts of Burgeo, Harbour Main, Bonaville, Ferryland and Fogo. All this is striking testimony of the general accuracy in counting the ballots, according to law by the Eighteen Returning Officers, appointed by the Government. The recount, however, serves a mead of praise on the fact that a revision of the count by a Judge should have disturbed their counting so slightly for it must be remembered that doubts do arise in every count as to validity of a number of ballots, and the Recount Judge had the advantage of his own legal training, his judicial experience, and the argument of counsel in guiding him to a correct decision. On the other hand these aids were absent in the original count. Considering the momentous nature of the decision, it is a satisfaction that the counts have been verified, and it is to our minds well worth the trouble and expense involved to have had the ballots scrutinized. Much credit is due to Mr. Justice Johnson on the way he has conducted the Recount. He has spared neither pains nor time to scrutinize the ballots carefully to correct any errors, and without loss of time. The counsel engaged on either side have done their work in a spirit which has kept up the best traditions of the bar, and are worthy of a mead of praise.

## Welcome to First Contingent From Grand Falls

The Governor Greets Them With Speech at Depot—Company "H" Escorts Them to King George Institute.

Though it was announced that the express would not arrive till 12:30 a.m., almost an hour before the time the Railway Station was crowded with people desirous of giving the Grand Falls volunteers a right hearty reception. Immediately on arrival of the express some 120 of our volunteers under command of Captain Montgomerie formed up on the station platform, and as each of the 30 young men who have given their services to the cause of right and duty stepped from the train, Instructor Hussey placed them into the ranks. The many persons assembled cheered the new arrivals when they had all detrained, and generally commented upon the splendid physique of the boys who have thrown in their lot with "Ours". His Excellency the Governor, accompanied by Mr. Cliff, the Chairman of the Reserve Force Committee, and Mr. Lloyd, the Secretary of the Recruiting Committee, was greeted by Captain Montgomerie, who in a happy way presented the loyal and patriotic Grand Falls volunteers to His Excellency. The Governor in a few well adapted words to the occasion then addressed the young men, commending them for the spirit they had shown in joining this cause which stands for all that is right and just. He spoke of the noble record that Newfoundland has made, and the spirit which has shown herself to possess since the first outbreak of hostilities, and His Excellency would remind every volunteer that both those who were already in training and our newly arrived recruits—that England would thank every one of them for this help and support they were about to give. In conclusion His Excellency congratulated the Grand Falls contingent for the spirit they had shown in being here to-day and the lead they had taken in forming the second battalion. He trusted that other settlements of our Island home would also give their aid to the Empire and the work in which she is helped by the brave Allies.

After cheers had been right loyally given for the Governor and the Grand Falls recruits, Company "H", under command of Lieut. Ayre and Messrs. W. J. Herd and W. F. Lloyd, proceeded down Water Street, the appearance of the Grand Falls boys winning much deserved recognition. During the march to the King George Fifth Institute, some lively and patriotic airs were rendered by two of the brave young fellows who were fitted on arrival, though the journey from Grand Falls to the city was a long and tiresome one. Another large number of the 90 who have joined at Grand Falls will arrive by the next express, due about Friday morning next.

### Supreme Court.

At yesterday afternoon's session of the Court, the case of the King vs. Francis Piercey was finished. Two witnesses for the prosecution were examined by Mr. Higgins and cross-examined by Mr. Morine. The accused being called gave evidence and was examined and cross-examined. Messrs. ## Messages Received Previous

**VOTES OF CREDIT.**  
LONDON.  
At the opening of the day, Premier Asquith expected votes of credit of £120,000,000.

**THE NEW WARREN.**

Premier Asquith had votes of credit in the day. His speech was entirely to the financial present situation, no reference to military affairs. The first vote of credit was supplementary estimates of the fiscal year, bringing war expenditure to the end of the financial year, 1916, amounts to £230,000,000. Asquith told the House the expenditure from April 17th of last year to Sept. 14th, 1915, was £230,000,000; from Sept. 15th to Dec. 31st, 1915, £250,000,000; and from Nov. 1st, 1915, to Nov. 7th and Feb. 1916, £250,000,000. Total of £730,000,000.

### FINANCING THE WAR.

Munitions for the Army from April 1st last to Feb. 22nd, 1916, the Premier said that loans to the Allies and the Dominions have amounted to £2,425,000,000. These by no means represent total advances from the Bank of England to the Allies from the war under this head, but probably reach to £2,425,000,000.
