Peace Treaty.

HORSEA, May 13. (British Wireless Service.) The following is a summary of the Turkish Peace Treaty: The Treaty first reproduces the text of the Coveant of the League of Nations to which functions are assigned in various places in the Treaty. The new provinces of Turkey are then described. The front of Turkey in Europe is approximately that of Chatalja lines, the northern half of the lines being, however, advanced in a northwesterly direction so as to include within the boundaries of Turkey the whole area of Lake Loerkos, which is a reservoir for supply of water to Constantinople Boundaries of Turkey, in Asia, remain the same ,except as regards the southern frontier. Provision is made for a possible modification of the present frontier between Turkey and independent states of Armenia by refer of the United States. Regarding Con stantinople Turkish sovereignty wil be maintained, but reservation i made that if Turkey fails to observ the provisions of the Treaty, particu larly as regards the protection of ninorities, the Allied Powers may nodify this provision. The navigaion of the Straits including the Dardanelles, Sea of Marmora, and Boshorus, is to be open in future, both n peace and war, and to military and ercial aircraft, without distinction of flag. These waters are not to be subject of blockade, and no belligerent right is to be exercised nor any act of hostility committed within hem unless in pursuance of a decison of Council of the League of Nations.
