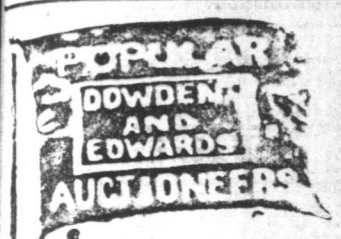

His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulation, under the Game and Inland Fisheries Board Act:—

"No person shall hunt, kill, or pursue with intent to kill, any Caribou, from the first day of January, 1925, to the 31st day of December, 1927, both days inclusive."
