Canadian Meat in England.

The following extract from the London Times of a recent date refers to what may become an important branch of our export trade:

Some carcasses of fresh Canadian beef and mutton, together with several turkeys, have been brought to Liverpool by the Allan steamer Scandinavia.

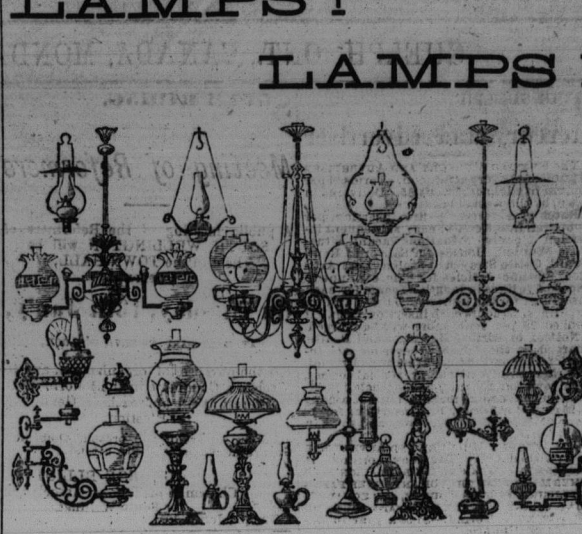
