We are informed that there are some three local companies with lines extending into the town of Aylmer, all independent, but all working amicably and none of them being operated as a money-making scheme, but for mutual convenience. It is to be hoped that the day is not far distant when a farmer in any part of the township subscribing to a telephone will be able to talk to any of the villages, or to any other farmer within the territory. Good luck to all; the more the merrier.
