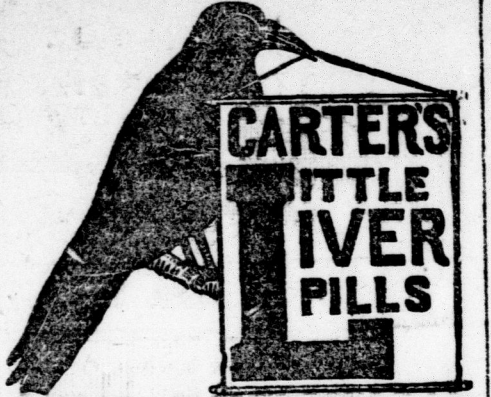

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STRANGLED TO DEATH.

Mrs. Butler, of London West, Meets a Peculiar Fatality.

Caught by a Window Sash in the Neck—Found Dying by Her Husband.

Mrs. Alfred Butler, 10 Peter street, London West, met with a strange and sad death yesterday.

Between 4 and 5 o'clock she returned home, having gone out to dinner. She had secreted the key inside the gate, but could not find it upon her return. She went to a side window, which is screened by lilac bushes, intending to enter through it. Standing on a small step-ladder, she raised the window and had evidently commenced to enter, when the sash fell, striking the back of her neck and pinning her to the sill, upon which her chin rested.
