and the United States, penny postage between England and America would be per feetly feasible, indeed non-contract steamers actually carry letters for the English post office from Southampton to New York for about a half penny each, that is forty letters go to the pound, and the rate paid to these non-contract steamers is one shilling and eight pence per pound. As to profits, Mr. Heaton calculates that the English Post Office matter would be from 50,000 to 60,000 pounds annually on the American mails.
