ROGERS BEATS DOUGLAS IN A SHOOTING MATCH.

Antarctic Cricketers in Disgrace—Result in England—St. Gatten and his team—Action on American weights.

The shooting match at Woodbine yesterday between James Douglas of the Aqueduct, and George Rogers of St. Catharines, for the Briggs challenge cup, at 25 birds each, 21 yards, resulted in Rogers winning by 22 to 18.
