

EXIT THE SUB-COMMITTEE.

THE COUNCIL WILL DEAL WITH THE RAILWAY TROUBLE.

Articles on the Engineer's Department - The Waterworks Management - Repair to Cost \$3000 at the Lake Creek - The Quality of the Guelph's Company's Asphalt.

The Board of Works met yesterday afternoon. Ald. McMurich opened the proceedings by expressing the opinion that the chairman and the Mayor had overstepped the bounds of their duties in trying to deal with the street railway question before the council had authorized them to do so.

Ald. Lamb thought that the committee was doing a good work in endeavoring to thoroughly investigate the matter and submit a plain statement to the council. Ald. Barns thought the Board had shown a lamentable weakness in abandoning its gas and consenting to clobber with the street railway agreement.

The Sub-committee Dissolved. Ald. Murray moved that the sub-committee be dissolved. Ald. McMurich and J. E. Verall, as well as Ald. Barns, also wanted to see the committee dissolved and a special meeting of the council called at once to deal with the question.

Ald. Bell, who led the sub-committee, pointed out that the reason no settlement had been reached was that the Mayor had suppressed the treasurer's financial report on the matter. He himself had suggested dissolving the committee at the last meeting, when he was plain that the Mayor was making fools of the members.

The committee was then dissolved unanimously. The next week to go on. Mr. McKenney and Mr. McNeill, of the street railway, were present and urged that the only wish of the company in making a new agreement was to go forward with the work.

The old agreement was satisfactory to them, provided the paving of the street was carried forward, not by piecemeal, but an entire street at a time.

Ald. Barns' motion was carried, to the effect that a new agreement be not now considered, but the work of paving the streets go forward at once.

Ald. Lamb asked the Mayor to authorize him to sign the Guelph contracts, but Mr. Grace claimed that the streets were being paved in a piecemeal fashion by the waterworks department at a salary of \$2000 per year.

Chairman Lamb had heard nothing of the matter. The following clause in the engineer's report was referred back to him for a report as to the advisability of placing a thorough competent experienced engineer in charge of the waterworks:

I beg to report for the information of the committee, that I have made the following appointments, via Mr. C. L. Fellows, C.E., who has been placed in the responsible position of chief engineer working connected with the Waterworks Department, and Mr. John Williams, C.E., in charge of all mechanical engineering work.

I am in addition to this arrangement, performed by these gentlemen in the department, that it is not a desirable arrangement, and should be discontinued, a change will be made.

Hanlan's Critic Defective. The engineer further reported that a steel lining for Hanlan's crib, at a cost of \$3000, is necessary, as the test which was made on the 4th inst., proved most unsatisfactory.

The Engineer was authorized to advertise for tenders for the work. The Quality of the Asphalt. A. D. Ellis, City Road Engineer, in his report on the Bermudez asphalt used by the Guelph Contract Company, says:

Ald. Hewitt thought that the Engineer had no right to send in a report like this to a committee, but Ald. Hill pointed out that in case the new asphalt proved a failure, the Engineer could point out this report, and thereby unload his responsibility on the council, which was his proper course. If the asphalt was not up to the mark the citizens could blame Ald. Hewitt and his colleagues for showing it through the council.
