The Weather For September.

Hicks predicts for September a storm period from the first to the fourth, with cooler weather and frosts "if" high barometer and westerly gales follow these storms ; but high temperature and threatenstorms; but high temperature and threaten-ing electrical storms may not subside en-tirely. From the first to the fourth is also a seismic period, the prophet says. Then there is a storm period on the 7th and 8th, another on the 12th and 13th, and wetill an-other on the 17th, 18th and 19th, which will affect land and sea, and there may be seismic throes and volcanic outbreaks. There will be a storm period from the 22nd to the 26th, and a reactionary disturbance on the 29th and 30th.



Important Directions Regarding Dried Apples.



DBeethoven

UDWIG VAN BEETHOVEN, born at Bonn, 1770, died at Vienna, 1827, disputes with Bach the title—"The World's Greatest Musician." In such high honor was he held that 25,000 people—including the nobility, poets, artists, musicians and the populace of Vienna—attended his funeral. Like Bach and Mozart, he was early a musical prodigy. Until he was 25 he appeared privately as a pianist before the nobility. After 1795 he appeared in public, both as a pianist and as a conductor; but increasing deafness compelled him to vice up both for composition.

as a pianist and as a conductor; but increasing deafness compelled him to give up both for composition. He composed all forms of vocal and instrumental music—from the song to grand opera and oratorio, from the sonata to the concerto and the symphony. Of his nine great symphonies, the Pastoral, the Eroica and/ the Choral Symphony are universally admired. The pianoforte sonata, developed by Mozart and Haydn, he made perfect. His Opus 27 No. 2, popularly known as "The Moonlight Sonata," is a household favorite. He was not so great a pianist as Mozart (who played the clavier), because he aimed more at originality and boldness in expression than at finish in technic. He was not so great as Liszt or Rubinstein because he was handicapped both by deafness and by an instrument which, while an improvement over the clavier, had nothing of the wonderful musical qualities of

Apples. As it is not generally known that with very little extra trouble apples can be dried so as to retain a nice white color, we give the following directions and feel sure a trial will give results entirely pleasing to you. ard assuring highest prices for your prc-duct. Directions :- Fill an ordinary sized pail about half tull of water into which stir a handful of common salt. As soon as each apple is peeled cut nito quarters, thim, and throw quickly into the salt water-as soon as a sufficient quantity is ready, drain off the water, which can be used again and dry quickly over the stove. Please bear i mind that apples should always be cut in quarters. Do not dry on strings, but use a wooden tray made of narrow slats.
