BREEDING IMPROVES BEES.

Successful Experiments at Duck

Island, Lake Ontario. Nearly every domesticated animal and cultivated plant has been im-proved by selective breeding. With bees, however, not much progress has yet been made because of the great difficulty in isolating them. They mate in the air at some dis-tance from the hive and it is known that the drone bee will fly for miles in search of the queen bee. It might be thought that the busy

bee could hardly be improved, but Canada contains varieties of solitary bees whose tireless industry make the honey bee appear dilatory in comparison. Besides, we know that great improvements await the bee breeder because some colonies store much more honey and are less in-clined to swarm than others. Any bee-keeper would give much to have his apiary composed of such superior

The Experimental Farms Branch of the Dominion Government has for some time been conducting experiments to overcome the difficulty of the isolated mating of bees. The first attempt was made on a large sandy plain near Kazubazua about forty miles north of Ottawa at a spot where no colonies of bees could be fewer within the country of the same could be fewer within the country of the same country of be found within three miles: but the young bees produced were dark col-ored, showing that the queens had been mated by the local black drones. Attempts were then made to mate the queens late in the day when the undesirable drones had ceased flying and also late in the season when these drones had died. The results gave valuable information but they did not solve the

problem.

Next, a part of the north country that bees have not yet reached was tried, the Experimental Farm at Kapuskasing in Northern Ontario being selected, but here the little colonies were made restless by the great and sudden changes in temperature, and swarmed out when the

queens flew.
In 1919, experiments were started on Duck Island which is situated near the eastern end of Lake On-tario, and is eight miles from the nearest island and over eleven miles from the main land. Duck Island covers only about two square miles and no bees exist upon it. The Duck

Island experiments were continued in 1920 and have proven successful, twenty-seven Italian queens of se

lected parentage having been mated by the drones that were brought with them. By continuing the work it is hoped to develop a strain of Italian bees that will be heavy honey producers and disinclined to swarm. Meanwhile, plans are advanced to distri-bute to Canadian bee-keepers a limited number of daughters of the best of the queens mated on Duck Island, and a system has been worked out by which a bee-keeper will be able to mate a proportion of the same strain.—F. W. L. Sladen, Dominion

Apiarist. Alsike and Sweet Clovers There are many farms on which it is not practicable to haul lime. In such cases alsike may be used, alone if the land is low and poorly drained, or mixed with red clover on the average worn farm on which red clover often fails. Alsike will not yield as well as red clover



Alfalfa is the King of Forage Crops. will under favorable conditions but many soils on which red clover would fail. It will stand a "sour" soil better than red clover will. Sweet clover will not thrive with-

out lime. There is no use trying it. But given lime it will grow on poor-er land than any other crop to improve such land. Sweet clover can be handled in a rotation the same as red, the seed is cheaper and in many places it may well take the place of red clover while the latter seed is so

"The demand for gasoline is growing day by day and economists are always prophesying that the world's supply will soon become inadequate," says Mr. C. H. Chilton, editor of the County Agent and Farm Bureau.

"Science has already taught us, however, that almost every growing plant contains alcohol which can be distilled at a very low price per gallon, and which in many respects is

superior in power to gasoline.
"There is enough waste on every farm to furnish its heat, light and power. The machinery is all availpower. The machinery is all available, and it is time that we should give this matter the most careful consideration. The principal difficulty of this plan will be to accumulate enough farm refuse to make the project profitable. Therefore it would be wise to have the outfit owned by some farmers' organization which will first encourage all farmers to supply a proportionate share in order that there may be sufficient material to make the plan successful."

Cow Consumes Buiky Freeas. When it comes to marketing grain. hay, silage, green crops, etc., the dairy cow is almost indispensable for economy. She consumes these bulky feeds, converts them into finished products easily and economically marketed and at the same time saves much of the fertility in the manure. Where hay, corn, fodder, etc., must be hauled to market there is considerable expense. If most of this expense can be saved there is a

wider margin for profit on the farm. Dairy Notes.

Milk cans should be washed as oon as emptied.

Thoroughly clean all utensils which come in contact with milk. Calves ought to get acquainted

with the feel of the comb and brush very early.

Feed all the roughage a cow will eat. She will eat more if fed two or three times a day. There is no other disease known
