British and Foreign.

THE Rev. David Reid, B. D., has accepted the call to the Free Church, Calcutta.

DR. STALKER was the preacher on a recent Sabbath in the University Chapel, Glasgow.

MR II. R. WILLIAMS spent only twopence on his election to the Middlesex County Council.

In France half the books taken out of the public

THE Rev. Andrew M. Porteous, B. D., formerly of Cullen, died of Fever on 20th. January at Ikorofion, Old Calabar.

A MOVEMENT is on foot in Edinburgh and Glasgow to establish a training institute for Christian workers in the Home and Foreign fields.

THE Rev. Dr. Whiteline is recommended by Kilmannock and Ayr Presbytery for the chair of practical training in the United Presbyterian College.

St. David's new church in Cromwell Street, Glasgow, was opened by Rev. Dr. Alex. Whyte, of Edinburgh, who preached with his usual power.

THE Rev. R. M. Lithgow has been ordained to Lisbon in St. Georges, Glasgow, Rev. Mr. Macgregor, of Renfield Church, preaching on the occasion.

GLASGOW Free Church Presbytery has sanctioned the proposal to erect a new church for Gorbals congregation. Rev. John Robertson has added 600 to the membership within a year.

CANON DRIVER'S Introduction to the Old Testament is now in the third edition. The work has been augmented by the addition of an Index of Hebrew and Aramaic words and one of Texts.

Dr. Brown, of Bedford, and Mr. J. W. Harrison, of Hauly, will represent the Congregational Union at the triennial council of the Churches in the United States, to be held 12 Minneapolis in October.

FRITAR congregation, Shetland, have unanimously elected Rev. Ronald S. M'Affer, probationer, Glasgow, as their minister in succession to the Rev. J. J. Dishington Smith, who has resigned through ill health.

By the will of Mr. William Motherwell, of Airdrie, \$5,000 has been left to the various Schemes of the Free Church, and \$500 to each of the West Church, the Town Mission, and the Female Benevolent Society, all of Airdrie.

WHEN Mr. Moody was addressing a meeting at Helensburgh recently the babies of some mothers that were present were looked after in a side-toom by young ladies—a good example, said the evangelist, of practical Christianity.

MESSES. EVRE AND SPOTTISWOODE have an edition of the Book of Common Prayer in the press, in which the source of each item in the book is stated in the margin, with the date at which it was introduced into the Prayer Book.

MERTOUN congregation have cordially and unanimously elected Rev. A. T. Donald, of St. Vincent parish, Glasgow. Mr. Donald has been ten years in Glasgow and has built up a large congregation, and has taken an active part in every good work.

MESSES. MOODY AND SANKEY'S Scottish campaign being almost over, they have resolved to rest in the South of England prior to setting out on their English campaign. They will also spend a part of the summer in an evangelistic tour in Norway and Sweden.

MISSS. E. S. MAIR, a granddaughter of Mrs. Siddons, lectured on "The Women of Shake-speare in the had of Falmerston Place Church, Edinburgh, under the auspices of the Literary Society. Rev. Armstrong Black presided over a crowded audience.

A SHEME is under consideration of the Western Committee of the United Evangelistic Association for acquiring the building in the East End of Glasgow, lately occupied by Buffalo Bill show, for a tabernacle for Rev. John McNeill. It will seat between 7 year and 5,000.

THE Rev. Dr. Voung, of Montreth, writing of lay Moderators of Assembly, says that the word "Tayman" is foreign to the constitution of the Church of Scotland, which discouns the division into clergy and laity, and that there is no law on the subject except that of custom

The Rev. Neil Brodie, senior minister of the West Church, Poliokshaws, died at Craigmore, Rute, in his eighticth year. Born in Campbeltown, he was ordained in Kilmannock in 1842, and at the Disruption cast in his lot with the Free Church He was afterwards minister at Shandon on the Gareloch.

THE Rev. Alexander campbell, of Knows Church, Montrose, died recently in his seventy third year. He was a native of Caithness-shire, and previous to entering the ministry was a teacher in the north. He spake several foreign languages and carried on an extensive missi mary work among the sailors at Montrose.

THE U.P. Synod's recommendations for co-operation with the Free Church have been adopted by Glasgow Presbytery with the proviso that in large Presbyteries like theirs deputies he appointed to co-operate at ordinations and inductions, and that the exchange of pulpits be left to the ministers themselves without Presbyterial arrangement.

WEALTHY Nonconformist Churches are increasing in London. Last year Rev. R. F. Horton's concregation raised \$39.665. St. Johns Wood Presbyterian (Rev. Dr. Munro Gibson's), over \$30,000, and not a lew others \$20,000. The stipend of Marylebone Presbyterian Church, vacant by the death of Rev. Dr. Donald Fraser, will in future be \$6,500.


