modern church is under the same divine influence as the church of Judea. But this, surely, is an untenable, and, if one go into it, an unbelieving position.-From "The Mind of the Master," by Ian Maclaren.

Compromise is not complete reform; and then too, where the change is not immediate, carelessness is liable to lead to laxity and finally to abandonment of the effort to reform.
