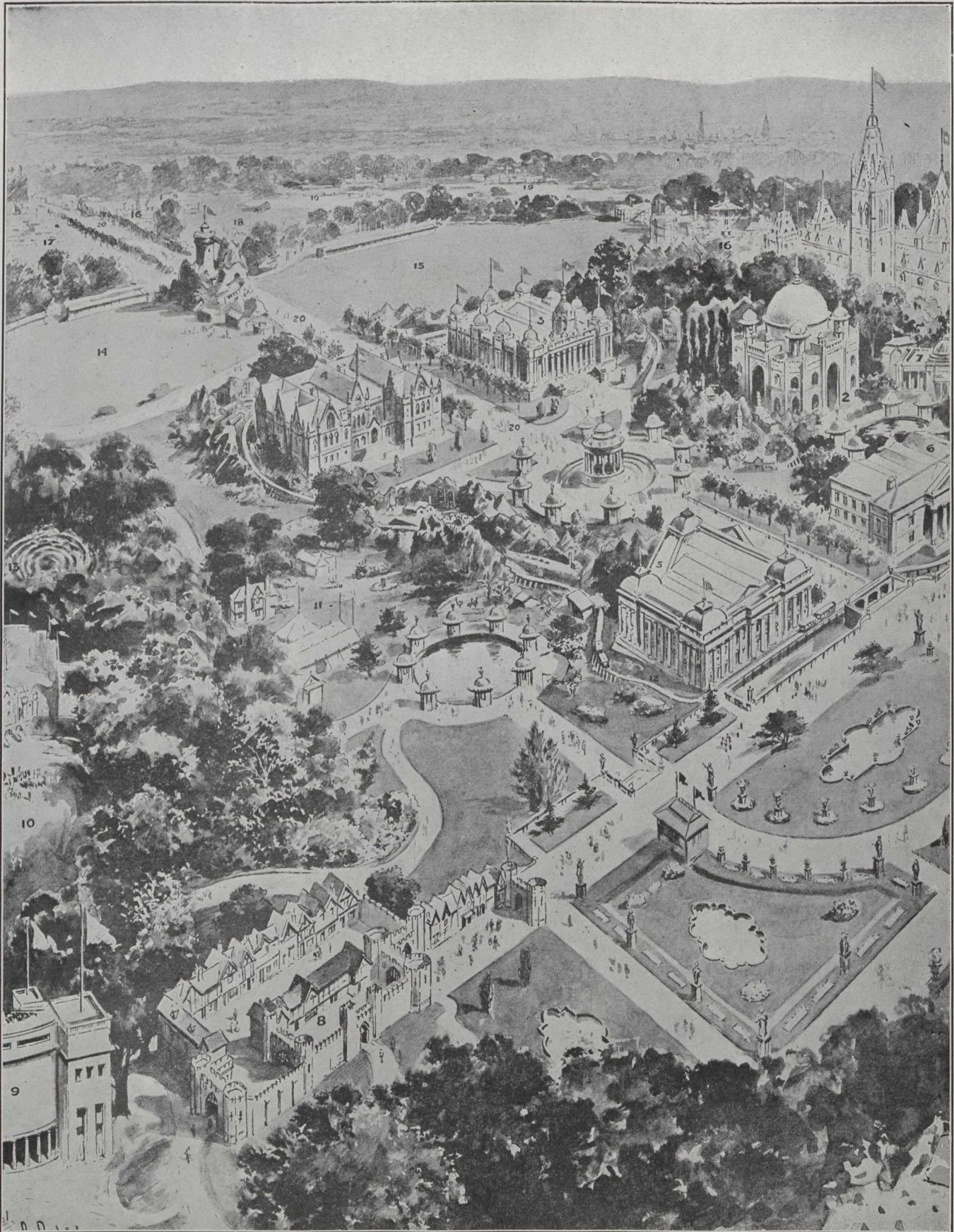


The Festival of Empire



The "All-Red" Line

One of the chief attractions of the Festival of Empire Exhibition, which will be held at the Crystal Palace from May until October, will be an "All-Red" Tour in grounds, by an electric railway and mechanical boat, through scenery typical of various parts of the Empire and past buildings representing the Overseas Dominions. The actual length of the railway will be one-and-a-half miles. A two-minutes' service will be maintained by ten observation-cars on which guides will be carried. The tour is to embrace Newfoundland, Canada, Jamaica, the Malay States, India, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa, all of which will be visited in twenty minutes.
