willingness of Canada to carry its share of the burden will be just as important - perhaps an even more important test of our dedication to the purposes and principles of the Charter than the efforts we make in such fields as disarmament and peacekeeping.

Another example of differing views on the priorities 34. to be attached to the different purposes of the U.N. is the Afro-Asian attitude towards apartheid, colonialism and what they call neocolonialism. They are all aspects of the drive to end the mastery of the non-white part of the world and particularly of black Africa by whites. Much of the activity of the U.N. with respect to this issue has had to do with the matter of conferring or revoking legitimacy. There have been speeches, resolutions and declarations galore, affirming the right of self-determination, denouncing the fundamental iniquity of the colonial system and proclaiming the duty of the colonialists to lay down the white man's burden.
