## ☐ CANADIAN UNIVERSITY IN FRANCE ☐


It is now possible for Canadian students to pursue a programme of Canadian studies during summer time in France. Laurentian University of Sudbury, Ontario, has recently, with the help of private sponsors, inaugurated a Canadian University in Southern France at Villefranche-sur-mer.

## Canadian University Programmes in France

The main programme of the Université canadienne en France has been designed to allow English-speaking and French-speaking students from all provinces to spend a year in southern France while continuing to earn Canadian university credits. An integral part of the Ontario university system, the Université canadienne en France programme offers a unique opportunity for students to complete a year of university credit while developing bilingual skills, broadening themselves through travel, and gaining a heightened appreciation of the diversity of Canada itself.

In addition to the main programme a variety of activities take place on the Université canadienne en France campus in the summer months. A sixweek Spring Session is held in May and June during which university credit courses are offered in French and other disciplines.

This session allows students to go to France at the end of the Canadian academic year and gain extra credits either in a full-time French immersion course or by combining the study of French with a course in their discipline in a bilingual environment.



## Canadian University in France

Care has been taken to ensure that Canada's languages and regions are represented in the Université canadienne en France community. The regular programme has a student body of over 200 anglophone and francophone undergraduates from all provinces. The intensive curriculum in language and civilization, which highlights a special theme each year (The Renaissance, The Mediterranean, The Enlightenment), is designed to give students a better understanding of our world. The setting provides an unrivalled opportunity to experience Europe and meet students from all parts of Canada and other countries.

The Université canadienne en France programmes are offered by Laurentian University, a bilingual university which was founded by act of the Ontario legislature in 1960, is recognized for quality teaching and

the personal attention faculty give to students. Its student body is a microcosm of Canada. The University is a member of the Council of Ontario Universities and the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada. Laurentian credits earned in the Université canadienne en France programmes are fully transferable to other universities. The bilingual nature of Laurentian express the belief of Canadians of vision and goodwill that the prevailing tendency in the shaping of our civilization ought to be toward unity. Laurentian is perhaps the most essentially Canadian of all the country's universities.

The Université canadienne en France programme has attracted a top calibre faculty from universities across Canada dedicated to the values of the programme. Faculty from Laurentian University and other Canadian universities will be joined by academics from other countries.
