<u>Letter from Prime Minister Jean Chrétien to Mr. Hosni Mubarak.</u>

<u>President of the Arab Republic of Egypt</u>

June 26, 1995

Dear Mr. President: All Canadians were shocked by [the] terrible assassination attack against you in Addis Adaba, and are relieved that you escaped safely. The Government of Canada strongly condemns such criminal acts. For my part, I hope that such senseless acts of violence do not deter you from pursuing the constructive policies which you have undertaken on behalf of Egypt. At the June 15-17 Halifax Summit, I joined with the leaders of other G-7 countries and Russia in strongly condemning all acts of international terrorism. We agreed to share more intensively our experiences of, and lessons learned from, major terrorist incidents, and to improve our cooperation in counter-terrorism. We also called on all States that assist terrorists to renounce terrorism and to deny financial or other support for terrorist organizations.
