## PRAYERS

Mr. Speaker informed the House that the Clerk of the House had laid upon the Table the Seventh Report of the Clerk of Petitions, stating that he had examined the petition of John Reynolds and others relating to capital punishment and finds that the petition meets the requirements of the Standing Orders as to form.

Pursuant to Standing Order 39(4), the following Question was made an Order of the House for a Return:

No. 564—*Mr. Symes*

1. What were the amounts of money spent by the Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce on publicity and/or information in each of the fiscal years 1972-73 and 1973-74?

2. What were the names and addresses of firms and individuals who received these contracts, what amounts of money were spent in each case and what was the purpose of each contract?

3. In the case of expenditures for publicity and/or information made within the Department by its publicity or information division, what was the amount in each case and the purpose of the expenditure?—Sessional Paper No. 301-2/564.

Mr. Reid, Parliamentary Secretary to the President of the Privy Council, presented,—Return to the foregoing Order.
