To Station and Freight Agents.

NEW GENERAL FREIGHT TARIFF.

I send you herewith a General Freight and Live Stock Tariff for the whole of the Line, which will come into operation on Tuesday next, the 1st December.

In order to ascertain the rates for freight, &c., by this Tariff, you have simply to find the mileage distance between your Station and the one to which the freight is destined.

This distance can always be found on the Company's Time Tables. Then by referring to the same number of miles in the Tariff you will find the rates to be charged for each class of freight.

In cases where the exact number of miles is not given in the Tariff you must take the next higher number.

The following are examples of the mode of finding rates by this Tariff:—
