unpleasantness ever arose, and the testimony of the survivor of them is, that his noble companion never once spoke harshly, nor uttered a single unkind word.

The surviving members of Mr. Shortreed's family are his beloved wife Mary Pettinger--to whom he was married on the first of January, 1868-two daughters and one son. Dare we intrude upon the sacredness of that Christian home, we could disclose, as reflected in the lives of those who were nearest and dearest to him, a still more beautiful testimony to the happy influence of Mr. Shortreed's presence and example while he lived, and the rot less blessed influence of his memory now that he is gone.

"He past; a soul of nobler tone: My spirit loved and loves him yet."
