Your Complainant charges and alleges to be the ease, that in consequence of the number of shares onto which the said property is to be divided, a sale would be do in more advantageous to all parties than a partition.

Your Complainant therefore recovery

Your Complainant therefore prays-

- 1. That it may be declared that a sale of the said lands would be more advantageous to all parties than a partition.
- 2. That an enquiry may be had and taken of what dower, if any, any party or parties are entitled to of and in the said lands and premises other than the Defendant, Matilda Little; and in case any parties may be found entitled to dower, that they may be made parties to this suit, and a sum of money may be set apart and paid to them and the said Matilda Little in lien of dower, and the said lands and premises sold, freed and discharged from such dower.
- 3. That the said lands may be sold, and the proceeds divided among those interested, according to their respective shares.
- 4. For the purposes aforesaid, that all proper directions may be given and accounts taken.
 - 5. That your Complainant may be paid his costs of this suit.
- 6. That your Complainant may have such further and other relief in the premises as to your Lordship may seem meet.
 - 7. And your Complainant will ever pray.
