

Ottawa, Feb. 11.—Special.—The Conservative party to-day reached an eventful point in its history. It saw the Remedial Bill introduced in Parliament by the Minister of Justice; it saw an important party caucus called to consider this question; it saw Sir Charles Tupper, Bart., enter the House as M.P. for Cape Breton and as Secretary of State in the Bowell Administration, and it saw Mr. Foster give up to Sir Charles the seat which he held as leader of the House since the beginning of last session. But it did not see and movement to substitute Sir Charles Tupper for Sir Mackenzle Bowell as Premier. If any of the Ministers and members had this in view, they have had the good judgment to abandon it. The old man is still in the saddle, and will in all likelihood continue there throughout the session. Mr. Foster has been a very able leader of the House under the most trying circumstances, and to-day there seemed an air of relief on his face as he took the position of first lieutenant. Mr. Foster goes into a secondary retirement for a while, where he hopes, no doubt, to emerge eventually with new vigor and increased power. Sir H. Tupper also withdraws to a private member's status, but he will be a good deal of a right hand to his father. Sir Charles Tupper has plenty of vigor left, and yet he is under the constant necessity of husbanding his resources. He had a trying day on the whole.
