RUSS AND JAP STILL AT TREATY

mouth Conference Not Yet Concluded.

London, Dec. 9.—The Times has received the following cable dispatch from its correspondent at St. Peters-

Contrary to the prevailing rumors, I understand there will be no important ministerial changes before the elections. The reactionary influences continue to be strongly exerted against Stolypin, and political wiseacres prophesy all sorts of combinations in which the names of Witte, Kokovtsoff and Vasilchikoff alternate. For the present, however, there is no reason to presume that the sovereign's confidence in Stolypin is impaired. The Novoe Vremya publishes an ap-

parently inspired note on the pending negotiations with Japan, which describe them as proceeding slowly, and not without difficulties. The note proceeds. "It is well known that the treaty of Portsmouth left not a few questions open. The Japanese Government, in discussing these questions displays a great deal of insistency, and interprets them with extreme latitude. The exacting tendency of the Japanese Government is particularly strong in its negotiations for a fishery convention; also with respect to a commercial treaty in connection with which leges irreconcilable with the interests of our borders. There also is proceeding complicated diplomatic correspondence regarding the sequestration of the Red Cross property seized at Port Arthur, the regulations issued in September for the usufruct of private property in Kwangtung, and the affairs of our fisheries. It must be hoped that the Japanese Government will become convinced of the necessity for a more conciliatory attitude, and then the negotiations will be quickly ended."
