RUSS AND JAP STILL AT TREATY
Settlements Following the Portsmouth Conference Not Yet Concluded.
London, Dec. 9.—The Times has received the following cable dispatch from its correspondent at St. Petersburg: Contrary to the prevailing rumors, I understand there will be no important ministerial changes before the elections. The reactionary influences continue to be strongly exerted against Stolypin, and political wisecracks prophesy all sorts of combinations in which the names of Witte, Kokovtsov and Vassilchikov alternate.
