

## FAVORITES WIN TWO FRIDAY AT HAMILTON

Trackless at 7 to 1 First on the  
Turf, Sir Galahad 1 to 2, Third  
—3 Second Choices in Front.

Two favorites, three second choices  
and Trackless at 8 to 1 proved the  
winners on Friday at the Hamilton  
track. The day was again fine, with  
the attendance up to the standard.

Bill Heron was away running in the  
first and won, as the favorite, Kate  
C. had a bad start, just getting up at  
the finish to beat Inspector Purvis for  
the place.

In the Canada race, Canine Maid, was  
chased by Shimonoseki and the latter  
giving Cape Saur a poor ride. Stable  
support went wrong on the favorite  
They were all strung out at the finish.

After failures for two days the favorite  
won the third for two-year-olds.  
Miss Imogene went long in the betting,  
probably carrying less than Lawyer  
Miller or King Ferdinand, and was in  
front all round. Patsy and the  
Lawyer Miller stepped ahead of Alarm  
to save some of the money that  
backed him.

Nothing but Please in the fourth,  
and here the public scored. Night Mist  
passed them all for second, and was  
getting to the favorite at the wire.  
Herman Johnson being third, where he  
was backed.

Redondo won the fifth all alone.  
Frank Collins driving past half the  
field for the place. Helen Virginia beat  
New Year II for the show. Harry  
agail picked a well-backed favorite  
behind the money, backers of Gay Dora  
being anything but satisfied.

The surprise of the day came in the  
sixth when Sir Galahad never got  
going and left hundreds in the ring.  
Trackless was a good mare, and they  
could not get near her. Lexington  
Lady being a length in front of the  
favorite.
