

### HAROSHIPS OF MISSION WORK IN FAR NORTH

Missionary Who Has Spent Thirty Years Among Eskimos Relates Experiences.

To have built a new church and then have it literally eaten in less than two months is an experience that the present day missionaries and ministers are seldom, if ever, called upon to

But strange as this may seem to the dwellers in the crowded cities, it is nevertheless an actual occurrence, and it happened to Rev. Edmund J. Peck, a prominent Anglican mission-ary, when he was stationed among the Eskimos in Blacklead Island, Baffin's Land

When this was ready the men scraped the fur off the skins and the women sewed the skins together.
