Col. 185, third paragraph from bottom of page should read thus :

The MINISTER OF INLAND REVENUE. The amount asked for is the same as last year. There are increases for three officers in the first-class. One is promoted from the second-class to the first-class. Outside of the two increases caused by the promotion of two third-class officers into the second-class there is only \$50 increase in that class. It is proposed to have seven first-class officers instead of six, ten second-class instead of eleven, and three junior second-class clerks instead of two. The number of messengers remains the same, with increases of \$30 each.
