HAMILTON MEN ON THE ROLL OF HONOR

Two New Names Added to the List of Those Killed in Action

AGAINST LEGISLATION

Hamilton Civic Authorities Oppose Ottawa and Toronto Bills

By a Staff Reporter. HAMILTON, March 30.—The fatality lists of the past week contain two new names of Hamilton men as being killed in action against the Germans. Albert Willey, 48 York street, who enlisted with the Princess Patricia's Regiment, was killed in France, while Lieut. F. C. Andrews, a Hamilton man, who was a reservist, and who enlisted with the Leinster Regiment, England, when the war broke out, was also killed in action. He is a brother of C. H. Andrews, 25 Main street, Toronto, and lived in Hamilton for many years.

Word has also been received by K. Williams, who is employed by the Ford Automobile Co. of this city, that his brother, Hiram Williams, who enlisted in Toronto, has been seriously injured and is in a hospital in France. Williams resided in Oakville, but a year ago attended the Hamilton Collegiate Institute.

Robert Loyal Davis, formerly a resident of this city, and a member of G Company, Royal 18th Regiment, who enlisted with the 25th Battalion, second contingent which is located at Winnipeg, died on March 15.

Word has been received by Lady Gibson to the effect that her son, Lieut. Colin S. Gibson, who was shot thru the lung a couple of weeks ago, is rapidly recovering and has been removed from the hospital in France to England, where he will remain in a hospital to recuperate.

KARLSRUHE ASHORE THEN BLOWN UP?

Ran on Reef and Was Wrecked to Prevent Capture

LIFEBUOYS WERE FOUND

Articles "Planted" on Island by Officers Before They Left

NEW YORK, March 30.—Edward Wadsworth of Newark, N.J., a passenger aboard the steamer Parima, which reached this port today from the West Indies, said that he had seen in Grenada two life buoys with the word "Karlsruhe" on them and that several German officers' caps had been washed ashore in Charles Bay, Grenada, and picked up by a fisherman.

Mr. Wadsworth said there was a report in the West Indies that the Karlsruhe had run ashore on a reef and was blown up by her own officers to prevent her being captured. According to this rumor, Mr. Wadsworth said, officers and crew of the Karlsruhe had put to sea on one of the ships which the Karlsruhe had captured and accompanied her.

Mr. Wadsworth said that the rumor was unfounded, although it had been admitted that the belief prevailed among white residents of the islands that the articles were planted by one side or the other to give the impression that the Karlsruhe had been lost.

WOMEN WILL WORK FOR PEACE CAUSE

World's Conference Soon Will Be Held at the Hague

DEMAND THEIR RIGHTS

As Human Beings and Mothers of Humanity, They Demand Action

CHICAGO, March 30.—Formal call for the women's international peace conference at The Hague was issued at the national headquarters today. "As women equally with men pacifists, we understand that planned for legalized wholesale slaughter is today the sum of all villainy," reads the call. "We women, we are especially the custodians of the life of all ages. We will no longer consent to its reckless destruction."

"As women, we are particularly concerned with the future of childhood. We will no longer endure without a protest that must be heard and heeded by men that hourly evil that in an hour destroys the social structure that centuries of toil have reared. Therefore, as human beings, and the mother half of humanity, we demand that our rights be consulted in the settlement of questions concerning not more the life of individuals, but of nations, be recognized and respected."

WILL HOLD GOOD FRIDAY SERVICES

Salvation Army Will Parade to Massey Hall Preceding Big Gathering

One of Toronto's annual events is the Salvation Army's service in the Massey Hall on Good Friday morning.

The title this year is "The First Good Friday," and will be one of the finest pictorial portrayals yet presented. A superb collection of colored and monochrome reproductions of the world's famous paintings, have been secured, and will be displayed by three powerful stereopticons. Some of these pictures have never been shown in Toronto. The scenic effects also promise to be the most brilliant ever arranged in connection with such a service. The musical portions of the program have been allotted to the Canadian staff songsters, the massed bands of the Salvation Army in Toronto, the United Songster Brigades, a children's choir of fifty voices and prominent soloists. Preceding the service the usual parade of all Toronto corps forces and bands will take place. The muster will be held on the parade ground by the armories (off University avenue) and Commissioner Richards will take the salute in front of territorial headquarters.

STRAND TO SHOW PARADE

Pictures of Military Parade at Strand Theatre This Week.

With his usual enterprise, Manager Schlesinger of the Strand Theatre has seen in today's parade an opportunity of securing for the patrons of the Strand something which cannot fail to interest and even enthrall them. GERMANY BEGINS TO FEEL PINCH

Reichstag Committee Claim Food Supplies Will Last Until Next Harvest

BERLIN, Mar. 19, via London, Mar. 20.—In the Reichstag today Count Frederick Von Westarp, reporting upon the deliberations of the budget committee said the committee regarded the measures taken by the government to conserve the food supplies as absolutely necessary. The committee, Count Von Westarp continued, was fully convinced as the result of a careful investigation that the food supplies in the country would last until the next harvest and that their replenishment for a longer period was assured. "We are, all convinced," said Count Von Westarp, "that the enemy's plan to starve us out will not succeed."

SPANISH SHIP TAKEN BY BRITISH CRUISER

FATE OF STRAITS IS IN BALANCE

American Embassy Already Approached to Save Constantinople

Canadian Press Despatch. LONDON, March 30.—With the Russian Black Sea fleet reported knocking at the door of the Bosphorus and the six allied battalions renewing the bombardment of the Turkish positions on the Dardanelles, the fate of the straits is today hanging in the balance, according to opinions freely expressed in London. Nevertheless, reports from Turkish sources still profess supreme confidence in the impregnability of the defending force, which, it is claimed, have successfully sustained a bombardment over 31 days.

The report of the British admiralty giving news of the sinking of three warships in the battle of March 18, French, is rather hazy as to the results achieved by this sacrifice, and it gives weight to the growing belief that the straits will be won until the naval operations are supported by effective land forces. The bombardment of Friday was interrupted by bad weather, but it is anticipated that the operations now will be pushed as rapidly as possible.

Another Bad Damaged. The French admiralty, while expressing the hope that some members of the crew of the battleship Bouvet have been saved, continues reports from neutral sources that the French battleship Gaulois also suffered severely in the battle of March 18.

While Turkish official reports minimize the effect of the bombardment and declare that Constantinople is not afraid, intelligence received from other near eastern points sets forth that negotiations already have been begun with the American embassy to act as an intermediary to save the Ottoman capital from the guns of all the allied warships.

Rumors of the destruction of the German sea-raider Karlsruhe have received some confirmation by the guarded statement of the British Admiralty that there is every reason to believe that this cruiser was sunk in the West Indies the beginning of November.

Say Russians Have Failed. Relative inaction prevails along both the battlefronts in Europe, which again seem to have relapsed into the condition of siege warfare which prevailed during the winter. Austrian reports by way of Berlin claim that the Russian offensive movement in the Carpathians thru the Lupkow Pass has resulted in failure, but direct reports from both Vienna and Petrograd agree that Austrians as well as Russians are making attacks and counter-attacks in the Carpathians without any decisive results.
