

Haycock, Dominion inspector of binder twine, who is now in the city, says that while in the west he imposed fines amounting to \$3,600 for short twine; one American firm was fined \$1,400, but as an illustration of the far reaching re-sults of such a fine, it actually cost the company \$12,000, by being forced to re-tag what was in the hands of the dealers. 
