## INGLEWOOD CO. **WANT THE POWER**

To Expropriate for a Sluice-Way---Fredericton May Issue \$8000 Worth of Bonds---Town of Dalhousie and Other Bills Up.

Fredericton, N. B., April 11.—The Corporations Committee this afforning had the Inglewood Pulp and Paper Company and bill before them.

H. H. McLean and Geo. McAvity were heard on behalf of the bill, and W. Watson Allen against it. The company wished to obtain powers of expropriation for the purpose of carrying their sluice way over a piece of land which the owner will not sell. The committee thought that they could not depart from the principle laid down last year, that a private individual or company could not obtain powers of expropriation. The bill stands over until tomorrow.

The bill to extend the powers of the Madawacka Log Driving Company was not recommended.

The auto road company's bill was recommended.

In the Municipalities' Committee, the bill to authorize the City of the repair of the streets and liabilities of the City at the end of the year, from which it appears that at the close of the year there was an overdrait of \$18,804, to which was to be added \$1,344, paid on account of a steam roller. They had on hand in cash \$7,568, and sewerage and water \$2,398.

There is due on ground rent \$750 and on sewerage and water \$300.

There are also \$11,000 worth of back taxes of which 75 per cent is good. The committee thought that under these circumstances it was not necessary to issue bonds to the amount of \$20,000 but they gave authority to issue bonds for \$8,000 to cover the cost of the steam roller and other capital expenditures.
