Because his present residence has outgrown its usefulness on account of the development of the diocese and the crowding into it of diocesan offices, Cardinal O'Connell of Boston has purchased a house at 49 Rawson road, Brookline, where he has taken up his private residence.

In a statement to be published in this week's issue of the Pilot it will also be announced that plans are under way for the erection of a commodious diocesan office building in Union Park street, opposite the cathedral rectory, which will probably be completed before another year.

Meanwhile the cardinal will make his residence in Brookline, although all official diocesan business is to be transacted at the present house, 25 Granby street, where mail and official business will continue to be transacted.

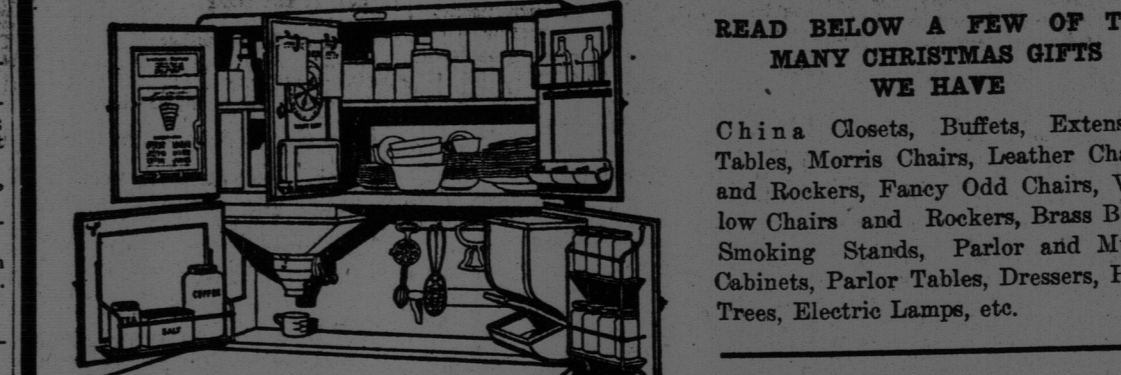
