ALLIED DEMANDS WILL GRIPPLE HUNS IN AIR

London, Nov. 27.—(Correspondence Associated Press)—For the Allies to take 2,000 airplanes from Germany, in accordance with the terms of the armistice, means militarily crippling Germany in the air beyond hope of early recovery, while immensely adding to the heaviest air fighting of the war, Germany lost in aerial combat with the British alone something like 2,700 machines. To this total must be added the destruction wrought by the French and American air services.

The expert asserts that for several months before the armistice Germany's capacity for producing airplanes was unequalled to the task of replacing her immense losses. This, he adds, was strikingly illustrated by the almost complete failure of her air arm during the final and most critical phase of the war.

London, Nov. 27.—(Correspondence Associated Press)—For the Allies to take 2,000 airplanes from Germany, in accordance with the terms of the armistice, means militarily crippling Germany in the air beyond hope of early recovery, while immensely adding to the heaviest air fighting of the war, Germany lost in aerial combat with the British alone something like 2,700 machines. To this total must be added the destruction wrought by the French and American air services.

The expert asserts that for several months before the armistice Germany's capacity for producing airplanes was unequalled to the task of replacing her immense losses. This, he adds, was strikingly illustrated by the almost complete failure of her air arm during the final and most critical phase of the war.

HARNESSING TIDES IN BAY OF FUNDY

(Christian Science Monitor.)

Sydney, C. B.—With the return of peace it is probable that there will be a resumption of the attempt to harness the tidal race in the utilization of the current-motor invented by Professor Clarkson, which was tested on the Cobequid River last year by Prof. C. M. Allen, chairman of the Waterwheels Testing Committee of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers. The motors are to be installed first between the bluff at Cape Split and a natural rock pier which rises from the water 400 feet or so from shore.

"The motors which can thus be first installed," the engineers report, "will give an amount of primary power sufficient to afford, for the first development, a delivery at the switchboard in the powerhouse of electrical current of 5,000 electrical horsepower continuous twenty-four powers, or such other distribution of this power as the market demand may require." On the top of the bluff a large reservoir is to be made and water elevated to it by the power from the current motors. At the foot of the bluff a power house will be built on the shore of the bay, equipped with hydraulic turbines actuated by water brought from the reservoir by penstocks. The head will be 325 feet.

At the base of Cape Split the tide runs with remarkable rapidity and for a greater part of the year the rise is from thirty-five to forty-five feet. The method to be employed in harnessing this tidal race is the utilization
