PEACE CONFERENCE MAY BE REMOVED TO A NEUTRAL COUNTRY.

Paris, Feb. 10.—The question of mov- ing the peace conference from Paris to a neutral country may be considered by the conference, if what is character- ized as the obstructive policy of the French press and certain French offi- cials continue.

President Wilson has been designated as the one who shall issue the formal call to the nations of the world to join the Society of Nations after its machin- ery has been set up by the peace con- ference.

Japan has notified China that she must work in harmony with Japan at the peace conference and must under- take not to reveal the conference to the secret China-Japanese agreements.
