#### CUT OF TEN CENTS A TON

Washington Announces Reduction in Government Fixed Prices for Bituminous

Washington, May 24—A reduction of ten cents a ton in government fixed prices for bituminous coal was announced today by the fuel administration as a result of the agreement under which the railroads will pay the fixed price for coal and abandon the practice of giving preferential service to mines furnishing railroad fuel.

Sealed tenders will be received at the City Hall, until Thursday, the 30th day of May instant, at 11 a.m., for coal required by the fuel administration for the City of Saint John, N. B.

TERSE STATEMENT BY HON. MR. CARVELL

Reply to Mr. Turgeon on Matter of Carquet and Gulf Shore Railway—Prolegation

Ottawa, May 24—During the last session of parliament, which prorogued last night, an item of \$518,000 to provide for the purchase of several railways in New Brunswick, among which is the Carquet and Gulf Shore Railway, caused some comment. The amount provided for the purchase of this road was \$200,000. O. Turgeon (Gloucester) wanted some information about this road, and the negotiations which the government was holding with it.

Hon. F. B. Carvell summed up the situation for Mr. Turgeon in the following concise terms—"My honorable friend asks for a statement. I will give it to him now. We offered the owners of this road \$200,000 for the railway. They can't make 200 cents out of it in the next ten years. We won't arbitrate. We won't pay any more. We think they will take it."

The item carried.

The sum of \$5,480,819 to acquire, clear of all charges, the Quebec and Saguenay Railway from its junction with the Quebec, Montmorency and Charlevoix Railway to Nain Falls, was carried.

In the dying hours of the session votes for domestic expenditure, aggregating \$100,000,000, were passed at the rate of \$25,000,000 an hour. Hon. W. S. Fielding protested against such short deliberation for important measures and suggested that the prime minister and his colleagues who were leaving for the imperial conference, could leave others to wind up the business of parliament. But the business was rushed through in time for prorogation at midnight.

In reply to Mr. Vira, Sir George E. Foster said that the government was giving careful consideration to cases of hardship which might arise under the Military Service Act, especially in connection with the calling out of young farmers.

Sir George announced that the object of the imperial conference was similar to those which have been held in recent years. The prime minister would be accompanied by Hon. Arthur Meighan, minister of the interior; Hon. J. A. Calder, minister of immigration, and Hon. N. W. Rowell, president of the privy council.

TWO NEW CABINET MINISTERS IN ONTARIO.

Toronto, Ont., May 24—Two new cabinet ministers have been appointed in the new government. Rev. Dr. H. J. Cody, rector of St. Paul's Anglican Church, succeeds Hon. Dr. R. A. Pyne as minister of education and George Henry, M. P. for East York, is the new head of the department of agriculture.

Mr. Henry will relieve the prime minister, Sir William Hearst, who has temporarily filled the agriculture portfolio. Dr. Pyne has been appointed to succeed the late John Shaw as clerk of the county council.
