TITANIC FUND NONE TOO LARGE FOR SUFFERERS

Report to Lord Mayor Shows That \$2,500,000 Raised Will Not be More Than Sufficient for Needs—Hundreds of Dependents

London, Aug. 5.—Although the funds for the relief of the Titanic exceeded \$2,000,000, reports made to the lord mayor indicate that all of this will be required to maintain the allowances now made for the relief of the dependents of the victims of the disaster.

Of 673 of the crew who were drowned, 533 belonged to Southampton and 138 to other places.

Claims have also been received on behalf of the dependents of 461 of the 517 passengers lost in the wreck.

Of these, 120 were British, 120 were French, 120 were Italian, 120 were Norwegian, 120 were Russian, 120 were Serbian.
