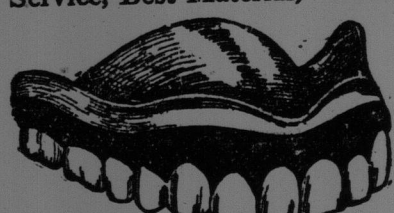

schedules in dispute between the em-
ployers and men in the building trades

were awarded at the rate originally asked
by the men, in a report of a board of
conciliation dealing with the dispute last
night.

cents, journeymen electricians eighty
cents, five cents less than their demands;
